## 43<sup>rd</sup> 'NIGHTJAR' NAVIGATIONAL SCATTER RALLY

Saturday 17th November 2018  
**SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS**

The NHAEG, for the Austin Ten Drivers' Club, will stage a Navigational Scatter Rally, on Saturday 17th November 2018, starting and finishing at the Village Hall, Old Basing, Hants RG24 8AT, Hampshire. The event forms part of the Inter Register Club Championship Series 2018 and details of the Nightjar itself may be found at [www.nhaeg.org.uk](http://www.nhaeg.org.uk). The meeting is held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (MSA), these Supplementary Regulations and such subsequent written instructions which may be issued prior to the event. MSA Permit No **tba**  
A maximum of 36 entries will be accepted from members of all affiliated IRC member clubs, plus the VSCC and other invited clubs and individuals. Entrants should produce their valid Club Membership Card at signing on and temporary NHAEG club membership is available at signing on for non-members.

The Meeting programme will be as follows:-

Scrutineering: From **3.15 \* p.m.** at the Village Hall Old Basing, RG24 8AT, Hampshire.

Drivers' briefing: **4.50 \* p.m.**

Route Cards: Issued from **5.20 \* p.m.** in age order of vehicles.

All cars to return by **10.20 \* p.m.** \* **Subject to change - see Final Instructions!**

Signing on: *All crew members must sign-on at least 30mins before their due start time.*

All vehicles must comply with MSA technical regulations and drivers are responsible for ensuring their insurance covers them for this type of event. Any vehicle considered to be excessively noisy, unsafe (e.g. faulty lighting) or detrimental to the spirit of the Rally will not be permitted to start.

The event consists of the following classes:

**Class 1, Pre-war cars.**

Sub-divided into: **Beginner** (Class 1B), **Novice** (Class 1N) and **Expert** (Class 1E)

A Beginner Team is deemed to be one which has never previously entered a rally

A Novice Team is one where no occupant of the car has won a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> overall award in an IRC or VSCC rally within the past three years, otherwise they are deemed "Expert"

**Class 2, Post-War Classics - up to 1978**

**Class 3, All other cars**

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations, and closes on **November 10th 2018**. Entry-fee is **£28.00 per vehicle/crew of two**. No additional charge, but a 10 points penalty will be imposed, for each additional crew member, in excess of two. Food will be available afterwards, at additional charge, (see Entry Form). The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event if fewer than 18 entries are received prior to the closing date and, please note, there is an entry limit of 36 with priority to "Regular Entrants" The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry and may refund entry fees at their discretion.

Inter Register points are awarded in **Class 1** to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> overall and best unplaced Novice, as well as for team places. A Team comprises the best performing three cars of a single marque. In addition, several other awards will be made:

- Class 1: Winning driver & navigator, 2<sup>nd</sup> place, 3<sup>rd</sup> place. (Provided 5+ in class)
- ATDC Trophy for overall Winners of Class 1
- Best (unplaced) Beginner Team in Class 1
- Best (unplaced) Novice Team in Class 1. Trevor Wild Memorial Trophy
- Class 2: Winning driver & navigator, 2<sup>nd</sup> place, 3<sup>rd</sup> place. (Provided 5+ in class)
- Class 3: Winning driver & navigator, 2<sup>nd</sup> place, 3<sup>rd</sup> place. (Provided 5+ in class)
- Best performance in an Austin 7.
- Greatest combined age of driver and vehicle
- Best performance by an NHAEG member in Class1.
- Youngest Driver or Navigator in Class 1 (aged 25 or under on the 17th November 2018). **Those eligible should indicate so by stating age(s) on Entry Form.**
- The fastest completion of 'Trevor's Teaser' (the most challenging Manned Control task)

Only named drivers may drive during the competition.

OS Landranger Maps Series 1:50,000 No 185 (Winchester & Basingstoke) and 186 (Aldershot & Guildford) will be required. The event covers approximately 63 miles. Vehicles to visit no more than 9 out of 12 Controls, (6 Manned / 6 Unmanned), tasks being carried out at Manned Controls on foot, against the clock, to discover concealed bird name signs. The M3 Motorway is out of bounds.

Competitors require a roamer for plotting grid references, magnetic compass, protractor, pencils, (pocket calculator and drawing compass could be useful), stout footwear and waterproof clothing (advised), plus **efficient** torches . The ability to walk steadily at a measured pace (i.e. 1 metre) will prove very useful, as might some familiarity with *herringbone and tulip* route descriptions.

Use of mobile phones\*\*, GPS and other electronic navigational aids/devices, during the event, is **strictly forbidden** and will incur **immediate** dismissal from the rally if observed.

Keep phones firmly out of sight - you have been warned!

\*\* Except in an emergency. Any legitimate request for relaxation of this rule will be considered on an individual basis.

A Soup Kitchen will again be located at one of the Manned Controls where, time permitting, crews can partake of a delicious, warming broth.!

Results will be announced as soon as possible after the finish but are subject to later confirmation.

Final Instructions, including your start time and any additional information, will be forwarded during the week prior to the event.

**NB A choice of meals, (optional), is available at a cost of £7.00, (see Entry Form). Tea, coffee and squash provided free of charge after the event and available at a small charge prior to it. As per usual, please bring along a change of footwear, for use following the event, to avoid introducing mud and other unwelcome deposits into the Community Hall.**
